MANAGEMENT REPORT OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

BMG BullionFund (the “BMG Fund”) invests in equal dollar proportions of unencumbered, fully allocated gold, silver and platinum bullion that is held by The Bank of Nova Scotia. The BMG Fund’s objective is to provide a secure and convenient method for investors seeking to hold gold, silver and platinum bullion for capital preservation, long-term appreciation, portfolio diversification and portfolio hedging purposes.

All physical bullion purchased by the BMG Fund meets the London Good Delivery standard as set out by the London Bullion Market Association (“LBMA”).

By investing an equal portion of the BMG Fund's subscription proceeds in gold, silver and platinum bullion, the BMG Fund should be able to effectively reduce its volatility while improving long-term returns. This can be accomplished because the value of gold is based primarily on its monetary qualities, whereas the value of silver and platinum is based primarily on their usefulness as commodities. During normal economic times, the commodity demand for silver and platinum should be higher than for gold, and the value of silver and platinum should typically outperform the value of gold. In contrast, if monetary demand increases, then the value of gold should typically increase faster than that of silver or platinum, although over time both silver and platinum should follow the price of gold. As a result, by investing in all three metals, the BMG Fund should be able to reduce volatility while improving long-term returns.

The economic factors that determine the price of gold, silver and platinum are also, in most cases, opposed to the factors that determine the prices of most other financial assets. Ownership of BMG Fund units, therefore, acts as a hedge against the volatility of other investments. Units of a class of the BMG Fund are not speculative, and are only intended to be one part of an investment strategy.

A small portion of the BMG Fund's assets (generally no more than 5%) may be held in cash to allow the BMG Fund to pay its expenses, and to facilitate any redemption of units of a class of the BMG Fund. The BMG Fund will not use derivatives or invest in securities or certificates of companies that produce gold, silver or platinum bullion. The BMG Fund will not invest in foreign securities, and does not hedge its holdings. The BMG Fund’s objectives and strategies did not change in 2020.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in the BMG Fund remain as stated in the simplified prospectus dated November 27, 2020. The principal risk associated with investing in the BMG Fund is the fluctuating price of precious metals, as well as fluctuations in the relationship between the Canadian and US dollars. In addition, the BMG Fund will be subject to precious metals risk, non-hedging strategy risk and specialization risk. Our view of the BMG Fund’s risk rating was unchanged in the 2020.

Results of Operations

All monetary amounts are expressed in Canadian dollars, unless otherwise indicated.

In 2020, the net asset value (“NAV”) of the BMG Fund increased 18.3%, from \$104.2 million at December 31, 2019 to \$123.3 million at December 31, 2020. The increase was primarily driven by \$27.6 million in realized and unrealized gains on bullion, offset by \$5.6 million in net redemptions and \$3.0 million in operating expenses during the period. As at December 31, 2020, the BMG Fund’s bullion holdings were 22,967 ounces of gold, 1,409,661 ounces of silver and 12,412 ounces of platinum, compared to 26,998 ounces of gold, 1,591,337 ounces of silver and 10,746 ounces of platinum as at December 31, 2019.

For the year ended December 31, 2020, the NAV per unit of the BMG Fund’s Class A units increased by 24.2% in Canadian dollars and 26.4% in US dollars, while the NAV per unit of the BMG Fund’s Class F units increased by 25.6% in Canadian dollars and 27.8% in US dollars. The better performance in US dollars is due to the Canadian dollar appreciation of 1.8% against the US dollar in 2020. Please see *Past Performance* for the performance data of other classes.

In 2020, the gold price increased by 35.7%, from US\$1,523.00 on December 31, 2019 peaked at a high of US\$2,067.15 per ounce in August, and closed at US\$1,893.10 on December 31, 2020. The prices of silver and platinum followed a similar pattern. The silver price reached a high of US\$28.89 per ounce in August, and closed at US\$26.33 on December 31. The platinum price reached a high of and closed at US\$1,017 per ounce on December 31.

Recent Developments

COVID-19 provided shocks across the global economy in 2020. Early in the year, the first diagnosis of the virus was made and quickly evolved into a media frenzy. As a result, governments across the world forced misguided lockdowns in an attempt soothe the public fears. Elevated levels of uncertainty became present in 2020, as many corporations and small businesses were forced to change the way they operated. However, the effectiveness of lockdowns is clear when comparing COVID-19 infection rates in California and New York vs Florida and South Dakota.

The effects of the virus were apparent with respect to major global economies, as both Canada and the US experienced significant declines in GDP. Canada's GDP declined 5.4% in 2020, while US real GDP declined 3.7%. These drops were synonymous globally; the average worldwide decline in real GDP was 4.2%.¹

Consequently, unemployment rates experienced rapid increases, reaching nearly 15% for both Canada and the US. The US has experienced a more promising recovery as unemployment rates have since recovered to 6.7%, which is nearly double the 3.5% pre-COVID-19 unemployment rate.² However, Canada's unemployment rate ended 2020 at 8.6%, which leaves more people unemployed than during the great financial crisis of 2008³. Amid the declining health of the economy, 2020 showed that the overall economy and the stock market are not the same.

To combat the repercussions caused by COVID-19, central banks across the world have inflated their balance sheets to aid their attempts to provide stability in the markets. The Bank of Canada swelled its balance sheet assets 15x larger over the course of 2020. It added over \$480 billion on a nominal basis.⁴ This is marginal in comparison to the US, which increased its total debt from \$22.7 trillion to \$28 trillion, a 23% increase over the course of 2020, causing the debt-to-GDP ratio to reach an all-time high of 130%.

The newly elected US government has already approved \$1.9 trillion in stimulus spending, and an additional \$4 trillion is anticipated; this will continue to worsen the debt situation, which should fuel continued uncertainty within markets. The rapid increases in M2 money supply identify potential risks of inflation in the future. In the US, over 20% of money in circulation was created in 2020 alone, contributing to the USD Index being down 6.7%, and Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell has already signaled that fighting inflation will be secondary to keeping interest rates low.

The risk of future inflation presents an excellent catalyst for precious metals in the future. Silver and gold bullion returns fared particularly well in 2020, capturing 1st and 3rd places respectively, with the NASDAQ coming in 2nd at a 43% return.

In Canada, silver started the year at \$23.40 and ended the year at \$33.74, which represents a 44.2% appreciation in 2020. In the US, silver started the year at US\$18.05 and ended the year at US\$26.49, which represents a 46.8% appreciation in 2020.

In Canada, gold started the year at \$1,974.95 and ended the year at \$2,409.26, which represents a 22.0% appreciation. In the US, gold started the year at US\$1,523.00 and ended the year at US\$1,891.10, which represents a 24.2% appreciation in 2020.

In Canada, platinum started the year at \$1,259.14 and ended the year at \$1,369.55, which represents an 8.8% appreciation in 2020. In the US, platinum started the year at US\$971.00 and ended the year at US\$1,075.00, which represents a 10.7% appreciation in 2020.

Overall, each of the precious metals displayed superior returns from a historical and relative context. With conventional measures like the P/E ratio at historic highs not seen since 1929, and with margin debt 314% higher than its 2008 level, it is clear that the equity market is overvalued.

In addition to an overheated stock market, the housing market appears to be in same situation with the S&P/Case-Shiller 20 City Index 42% higher than the 2008 value, with 10% of that increase coming in 2020 alone. Given the historical levels of these measures, the value of adding precious metals to a portfolio have never been higher. Adding 10% in gold bullion to a standard 60/40 portfolio increases the compound annual growth rate from 6.59% to 7.07%, while increasing the Sharpe ratio from .61 to .70. Adding 20% in gold bullion to the portfolio increases the compound annual growth rate from 6.59% to 7.52%, while increasing the Sharpe ratio from .61 to .77

Considering the existing economic conditions and potential of downside catalysts due to mounting geopolitical unrest, it can be anticipated that precious metals will continue appreciating and likely outperforming most other asset classes throughout 2021.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager and Trustee

BMG Management Services Inc. (the “Manager”) is the manager, trustee, registrar and transfer agent for the BMG Fund. The Manager provides, or arranges for the provision of, all management and administrative services for day-to-day operations, including providing fund and unitholder accounting, recordkeeping and other administrative services. At December 31, 2020, the Manager held no units of the BMG Fund.

In consideration of management and administrative services, the BMG Fund pays the Manager a monthly management fee based on the NAV of the various classes of units of the BMG Fund, calculated daily. For the year ended December 31, 2020, the BMG Fund incurred management fees of \$2,151,928.

Distributor

BMG Marketing Services Inc., an affiliate of the Manager, has been retained by the Manager to assist with the marketing and distribution of units of the BMG Fund in the exempt market pursuant to prospectus exemptions.

Independent Review Committee

The Manager has created an independent review committee (“IRC”) to review and provide impartial judgment on conflict of interest matters. The IRC reviews potential conflicts of interest referred to it by the Manager, and makes recommendations on whether a course of action is fair and reasonable for the BMG Fund. Explanatory Notes to Financial Highlights

Fund's Net Assets per Unit of each Class

(1) This information is derived from the BMG Fund's financial statements. In the period a BMG Fund or class is established, the financial information is provided from the date a particular class was first offered to the end of the period. The NAV per class presented in the financial statements does not differ from the NAV per class calculated for fund pricing purposes.

(2) Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) in net assets from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the fiscal period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of opening and closing net assets per unit.

Ratios and Supplemental Data

(1) This information is provided as at the end of the period shown.

(2) The management expense ratio is based on total expenses for the stated period, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average NAV during the period.

(3) The trading expense ratio represents the total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of NAV during the period.

(4) The BMG Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the BMG Fund's bullion investments are traded. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the BMG Fund buying and selling all its bullion once in the course of the relevant period. There is no trading cost payable by the BMG Fund. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the BMG Fund.

Management Fees

Management fees are paid by each class of the BMG Fund to the Manager, and are calculated at the applicable annual percentage of the NAV of each class of the BMG Fund. The Manager provides, or arranges for the provision of, all management and administrative services for day-to-day operations, including providing fund and unitholder accounting, recordkeeping and other administrative services. A portion of the management fees paid by the BMG Fund is for trailer fees paid to dealers. The trailer fees are a percentage of the daily average NAV of the applicable class of units of the BMG Fund that are held by the dealers' clients. No trailer fees are paid with respect to Class C1, Class C2, Class C3 and Class F units of the BMG Fund. The table below outlines the BMG Fund's annual management fees for the Class A, Class B2, Class B3, Class C1, Class C2, Class C3, Class D and Class F units of the BMG Fund, and how those fees are split between trailer fees and portfolio administration.

Operating Expenses

During 2020, the Manager did not absorb BMG Fund operating expenses, because the management expense ratios were below the expense cap. The decision to reduce operating expenses is made at the discretion of the Manager, and may be changed at any time.






Year-by-Year Returns
